THE ROTARY FOUNDATION CENTENNIAL IDEAS
Have a party with Rotary and guests. Make it potluck (Arch Klumpf's favorite meal) and charge \$26.50.
Perform 100 Random Acts of Kindness per Rotary club.
Host a face-to-face campaign where each Rotarian asks for \$26.50 from one person who is a non-Rotarian. Money to go to any of the main areas of focus.
Million Dollar Dinner - donation (3 year term)
Press release - highlight what we've done locally
Family Fun Day - ask Rotarians and non-Rotarians
District level commitment for every member to donate to the Foundation.
Support District Foundation Dinner
Foundation birthday party on February 23rd
Champagne toast to The Rotary Foundation
Joint multi-club celebration of TRF with a big cake. Invite the public to celebrate and publicize it in the media.
Get videos on what The Rotary Foundation does in schools and universities
Get videos from Rotary International and post on Facebook.
Community event to educate public and seek club members and community donations to TRF to reach \$2,650.00.
Celebration party for all Paul Harris Fellows
Club meeting devoted to TRF - have a special guest speaker
Increase number of Paul Harris Fellows - host a celebration and take a group photo.
Road Show - each club in Area hosts a public forum on (a) water, (b) literacy, (c) polio or (d) maternal and child health.
Return to 100% Foundation sustaining membership
At a community event, sell or distribute bottled water with a label promoting Rotary's water and sanitation efforts.

POLIO ERADICATION AWARENESS AND FUNDRAISING IDEAS
Promote map of the world before polio initiative and map of the world after polio initiative. Post on all Facebook pages.
Advertise purple pinkie on Rollin' with Rotary truck.
Public forum - 100 steps = 100 years - invite community members to get engaged - "Footprints to Eradicate Polio" - sell footprints with milestones in a local shopping center - countdown "23" cases left
Media interview slogan - Be Part of the End
Post signs around town with purple pinkie information.
Focus on how close we are to polio eradication
Host event with a "hook-up" - Pizza for Polio, Paddling for Polio, Pennies for Polio (school children), Pasta for Polio
Large "End Polio Now" banner hanging over main street
Have polio survivor speak to clubs
Develop a donation website for PolioPlus
Invite a polio survivor to talk about their life experiences.
Have PolioPlus container on each table each week. Total money collected from year to be donated to polio fund.
Sponsor a "Walk for Polio" to raise awareness of polio initiatives.
Tell the story of Rotarians who are doing the work. We are part of something huge! We are changing the world!
Put together statistics on the progress we have made over the years on Facebook/news for distribution
Pig Out for Polio - roast pig and brew!
Need to educate new Rotarians about our polio eradication story.
Full page member picture of "we are this close" advertisement in local newspaper.
Be specific about how much fundraiser money goes to PolioPlus
Host purple pinkie event at school. Start now and encourage students to wear purple and bring change.
